

SLAM TRIPS

1. Masks are required to be worn. If a participant arrives without a mask they may be given one or asked to go purchase one.
2. Every two chairs will be empty OR people sit arm length away from each other.
3. Tape will be put on chairs to indicate where to sit in order to maintain social distancing. Tape will be placed on carpet where chair should be for circle gatherings. Tables will be zig-zagged.
4. Doors and windows will remain open during Slam (except door at night), even in inclement weather, with gloves & sanitizer available at the door.
5. High risk individuals (people over 60 and those with underlying health conditions), whether staff, volunteers, or program participants, should strongly consider continuing sheltering in place.
6. Staff & the participant leaders work closely together during Slam.

SOCIAL DISTANCING WHILE ON CAMPUS

1. Alternative means of greeting each other will be used: waving, air high fives, etc. No physical contact.
2. Staff do not shake hands with participants, ever.
3. Practice social distancing.
4. If anything (papers, craft items, etc.) needs to be distributed, such items will be placed individually on a table for people to pick up.
5. Tables will be spaced out to maintain social distancing and the number of chairs per table minimized / limited.
6. Participants will not go to the restroom together. They will go individually. Three at a time and only for restroom/shower/clean-up purposes – not to hang out.

Other adjustments to allow for social distancing?

SLAM TRIPS COVID PROTOCOLS

1. If we follow the protocols laid out by Gov. Jay Inslee Slam Trips groups may all stay in the same facility.
2. No self-serve stations for drinks or food will be allowed.
3. Only individually wrapped food items that are distributed by a staff with mask and gloves will be allowed.
4. Special attention will be taken to sanitize and sterilize any area where people gather to eat and drink both before and after the gathering.
5. Slam should be conducted using the CDC guidelines for attendance capacity (e.g. 10+, 50+, 100+) and conform to the same rubrics for best practices (e.g. wearing masks, maintaining social distancing, etc.) as are followed for other places in our state and YN.
6. If the guidelines or rubrics cannot be followed, Slam Trips should be cancelled.

Work Sites

1. Worksites will be at community places instead of individual elder's homes.
2. Latex gloves will be worn by each person as well as work gloves. Sanitize each tool before next person uses it.
3. A porta-potty will be placed at each work site.
4. What precautions will be taken to minimize risk? Working at community buildings instead of individual homes.
4. Special attention should be taken to sanitizing and sterilizing any tool that people might be using.

Cleaning and sanitizing ANC

1. "Cleaning Teams" will be established to sanitize all rooms before and after every gathering and every day.
2. Members of cleaning team will roam the area and/or be stationed at key points of contact (e.g. doors, stair rails, etc.).
3. Maintain a good stock of tissue, soap, hand sanitizer and disposable paper towels for drying hands.
